Walk For Life Helps Choices Toward Goal

Recently, a small but dedicated group from the Saints Peter and Paul High School's Pro-Life Club, including moderator Mr. Alex Pool, gathered with about a hundred members of the community at Idlewild Park in Easton to support the *15th Annual Walk for Life*. This event was to benefit **Choices for Life**, a Christian ministry that offers free and confidential life-affirming services to women and their families when faced with an unexpected pregnancy. All proceeds from the event will be used to enable Choices to become a medical facility equipped with a sonogram machine and for training ultrasound technicians and client advisors. According to Choices, at least 85% of women will choose life once they have viewed their unborn child through a sonogram.

Festivities surrounding the event included breakfast, face painting, and live music by local Christian bands. Congressman Andy Harris addressed and encouraged the walkers. Then, it was off to march! The route began at Idlewild Park and stretched to downtown Easton before looping back around. *Junior Corey Lapres* said of her experience, "I got my face painted and I got to help carry the banner around town for a little bit. It was a lot of fun!" Chick-fil-A showed their support for the community and the pro-life movement by handing out free chicken sandwiches and coupons for free sandwiches.

Finally, prizes were awarded to participants who raised the most donations. Saints Peter and Paul senior and active Pro-Life club member *Courtney Murray* won first prize after raising over \$1,000. "Our mission is protecting life, especially for those who cannot protect themselves," she said, describing her motivation, "But, we need money to provide services that help women make the decision to keep their children."
