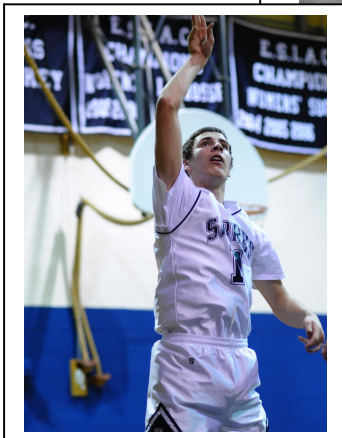

Clubs & Activities

ACE Engineering Mentoring Program

Moderator: Mrs. McQuaid/ACE Mentors



Activity Description/Purpose:

The ACE Mentor Program introduces area high school students to architecture, construction, and engineering by matching them with professional mentors. Students work together in teams creating and planning architectural and cost designs for a project that interests them. There are scholarship possibilities. Meeting Times/Commitment: Tuesdays & Thursdays after school (3:15-4:00)

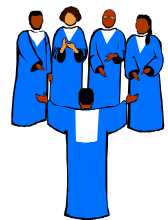
Chorus

Moderators: Mr. Leve & Mrs. Aroom, MS, RN (Shore Health System), & Katy Eslami '11

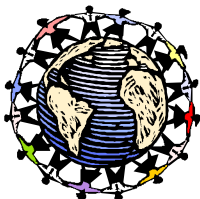
Activity Description/Purpose:

Mock Trial

Activity Description/Purpose:

Students will have the opportunity to participate in the legal arena in a variety of roles. Team members are chosen through tryouts and compete against other schools from across the state. The Mock Trial Team is assigned specific cases and roles that they must defend/prosecute in an actual court of law.

Peer Tutoring

Student peer tutoring to provide additional academic support to students all subject areas. Any student and/or parent may request peer tutoring support. Peer Tutors must be in grades 9-12, with a minimum GPA of 3.0 in the subject they are tutoring, and demonstrate positive attendance and attitude. Peer tutors must be willing to tutor a minimum of once a week for at least thirty minutes. Interested peer tutors will attend a training session hosted by the Guidance Department.

CAMPUS MINISTRY & SPIRITUAL FORMATION

Saints Peter and Paul High School is called to be a faith community. It is the mission of the Theology and Campus Ministry Departments to respond to this call by creating opportunities for the students, parents, faculty, and staff to build and experience community. As we enter into this endeavor we will be guided by two principles:

- ✝ ***God is central in every aspect of building a faith community***
- ✝ ***All members of the school have essential roles in the process of building a faith community***

Teaching Theology, nurturing spirituality and promoting service are the three dimensions that will be integrated into life at Saints Peter and Paul High School to create and foster this community. The following opportunities are provided through the Theology Department:

✝ ***Retreats***

All students of Saints Peter and Paul High School are afforded the opportunity for reflective spiritual growth through a four-year retreat program. The Juniors and Seniors are offered the opportunity for overnight retreat experiences while Freshmen and Sophomores attend day retreats.

✝ ***Liturgy & Prayer***

The celebration of the Holy Mass and daily prayer are a central focus of the Saints Peter and Paul High School faith community. Through liturgical planning, Choir/Music, and Lectors, students are provided a broad avenue for involvement in the spiritual life of the school.

✝ ***Service***

As all members of the Saints Peter and Paul community seek to emulate the life of Christ, a diverse array of service opportunities are provided to students to become more involved with their school, parishes, and local community. Through Special Olympics, Mission Trip, Hospice, St. Vincent DePaul Society and others, students share their talents and time over their high school career. All students are required to participate in a Christian Service Program over their high school career at Saints Peter and Paul.
