Old Business:

1. Discount Cards – Debbie Mister is having trouble getting businesses to agree to be on the SSPP discount card. If you have any suggestions for businesses to be contacted, please call Debbie. She is planning on having the cards ready for Back-to-School Night next year.
2. Teacher treats – Gail Easterling is coordinating volunteers to bring in treats for the teacher coffee station every Friday for the remainder of the year. If you are interested in contributing, please contact Gail.

New Business:

1. Used Clothing Sale – Paula Reisberg notified those present that Little Rascals would like to coordinate a used clothing sale in early June. The owner would be willing to take care of the sale and donate 85% of the proceeds to SSPP. Mrs. Webster will contact Betsy Greaney, who usually handles the sale, to see if she is still willing to coordinate it. This is the first choice since SSPP keeps 100% of the proceeds.
2. Local cards – Target has a Red Card (actual credit card) that customers can sign up for and have a portion of their purchases be given to the school. Also, Food Lion will soon be offering a bonus card that is similar to Giant's Bonus Bucks. Information will be forthcoming about the Food Lion card.
